

Ship *Young Phoenix* on the Coast.
 Saturday July 20th commences with light breezes from South standing to the East with all sail out employed setting up stooks at 3 P.M. saw a school of whales to windward coming to Leeward lowered boats at 4 P.M. fasten to 4 whales and saved one small cow at 8 took it to the a large body of whales but she and crew and parted Middle part getting ready for cutting at daylight call all hands and hook on at 4 finish made sail very light airs from S.W. standing to the West a gail on site to the North Lat. 18.45 S Long 115.22
 Sunday 21st light airs from S.W. standing to the N.W. at 5 P.M. took ship to the S.E. and commenced hauling Middle part the same Latter a fine breeze made all sail at 6 P.M. finish hauling so ends saw nothing Lat. 18.56 S Long 116.22 East
 Monday 22nd a fine breeze from South standing to the S.E. at 6 P.M. shorten sail neared ship to the N.W. Middle part the same Latter very light headed to the west so ends Lat. 18.58 S Long 116.13 E
 Tuesday 23rd first blowing airs from S.W. Middle a. fresh breeze from S.E. steered W. at 12 neared ship to the East at 3 P.M. wind came in to S.E. blowing on at daylight double reefed headed S.E. Latter blowing heavy bent a main topsail and close reefed him and set him full fore and mizen so end this day Lat. 18.18 S Long by Chron 116.30 E
 Wednesday 24th first part a heavy gale from S.E. headed S.W. South under close reefed main topsail and fore sail Middle and Latter parts the same employed mending sail and refitting the spare boat so end this day Lat. 18.40 S Long by Chron 115.59 E
 Thursday 25th first blowing heavy from S.E. under close reefed main topsail and fore sail Middle and Latter parts the same at 7 P.M. neared ship to the N.E. so ends Lat. 19.05 S Long 115.32 E
 Friday 26th moderate set fore and mizen topsails Middle and Latter parts fine weather and no fish so ends Lat. 18.54 S Long by Chron 115.40 East

 Remarks on Board *Saturday July 27th*
 This day commences with fine weather a light breeze from S.E. standing to the N.E. with all sail out employed repairing sails Middle very light Latter a fine breeze from S.E. standing to the S.E. saw nothing employed repairing sails so ends Lat. 18.27 S Long by Chron 115.43 E
 Sunday 28th first part fine weather with a fine breeze from S.E. steering W.S.W. at sunset neared ship to the N.E. shorten sail for the night Middle part light airs Latter steering to the West so ends Lat. 18.23 S Long 115.29 East
 Monday 29th first part a light breeze from S.S.W. standing to the west at 5 P.M. spoke the *Redman* Capt. Dexten 14 months out with 2400 lbs oil 1000 whale Middle part the same Latter part strong breezes so ends Lat. 18.11 S Long 115.15 E
 Tuesday 30th first part light breezes from westward at 5 P.M. spoke the two brothers *Houlland* 10 months out with 400 spiron Middle moderate Latter strong breezes and equally standing to the S.E. so ends Lat. 18.24 S Long
 Wednesday 31st first part strong breezes from South standing to the S.E. under double reefed topsails Middle and Latter parts the same at 8 P.M. standing to the S.E. so ends Lat. 18.40 S Long 116.00 E
 Thursday August 1st strong breezes from South under double reefed topsails standing to the S.E. at 8 P.M. neared ship to the West full fore and mizen topsails Middle at 7 P.M. neared ship to the East strong so ends Lat. 18.26 S Long by Chron 115.55 E
 Friday 2nd first part moderate little set fore and mizen topsails at 2 P.M. the ship to leeward saw Whales made all sail and capt of at 3 saw the boats and whales at 4 lowered and fasten to 9 whales and got 3 one large whale lost another weft and several killed at 5 P.M. all to the ship took in sail and set the watch at 5 P.M. hook on to the large whales at sunset blowing a heavy gale neared ship at 11 got the large whales and took on board a small one Lat. 18.18 S
