

Ship Young Phoenix con.

Saturday August 3rd blowing a heavy gale from S.E. at 3 P.M. got in one small one gale abated but a tremendous sea on impossible to cut set the main topsail again Middle employed cutting up the blubber Latter cut body of the other but kept the head blowing a heavy gale impossible to cut the large whale head commenced boiling at 3 so ends this day Lat 18.10 Long 114.10
 Sunday 4th commences with a heavy gale from E.S.E. at 3 P.M. moderated a little set the lee clew of the fore sail Middle & part breeze on again Latter the same at 4 P.M. hook on to the head at 11 finish set the fore sail hook so ends Lat 18.31 Long 115.14
 Monday 5th a little more moderate employed cutting up the junk Middle and Latter parts the same payable weather so ends Lat 18.41 Long 116.11
 Tuesday 6th commences with fair whale weather at 2 P.M. weared ship to the N.E. at 5 P.M. finish boiling Middle part the same Latter part blowing a gale again so ends Lat 18.41 Long 116.52
 Wednesday 7th commences blowing a gale from S.E. headed to the under close reefed main topsail and fore sail Middle part the same Latter set close reefed topsails employed coopersing the oil scum Lat 18.41 Long 117.57
 Thursday 8th commences with a strong gale from E.S.E. strong N.E. at 1 P.M. weather looked bad gale fore and main topsails and fore sail Middle part blowing heavy Latter part moderate at close reefed topsails employed stowing in the steerage standing to the South Lat 18.57
 Friday 9th commences with fair whale weather standing to the S. Middle part the same Latter part steering to the N.E. a sail in site Lat 18.18 South
 Saturday 10th commences with overcast weather wind from E.S.E. standing to the S.E. abundance of small fish round the ship Middle breeze on took in fore and main topsails Latter rainy at 10 weared ship to the North so ends No Obs. this day
 Sunday 11th blowing a heavy gale from N.E. Middle the same Latter light breeze from S.W. with overcast weather standing to E.S.E. so ends No Obs. this day

the Coast of New Holland 1839.

Monday August 12th commences with light breeze from S.E. steering E.S.E. at 6 P.M. shorten sail for the night Middle and Latter parts weather the light squalls of mist at 8 P.M. saw dead whale but to cut so ends Lat 18.15 Long 114.30
 Tuesday 13th commences with moderate breeze from S.W. standing to the S.E. light squalls of rain employed setting up shock Middle and Latter parts overcast but no rain No Obs sun obscured
 Wednesday 14th first part overcast wind from S.E. steering N.E. at sunset shorten sail weared ship to the S.W. Middle and Latter parts fine at daylight weared ship to the East all sail out employed setting up spooks so ends Lat 18.04 Long 116.30
 Thursday 15th first part fine all sail set steering to the East at 6 P.M. weared ship to the S.W. Middle part very light breeze Latter a fine breeze heading up W. S.W. so ends Lat 18.58 Long 116.38
 Friday 16th commences with strong breeze and clear weather steering to the W. S.W. saw nothing Middle and Latter part fine weather setting up shocks saw nothing so ends Lat 18.12 Long 115.35
 Saturday 17th commences with fine weather wind from S.E. steering to the East at 2 P.M. got under made the Chree to show 40 more turns than the sexton Middle part stood to the S.W. at 12 weared to the East again Latter part steared S.W. strong breeze so ends Lat 18.40 Long 115.41
 Sunday 18th commences with strong breeze from East standing to the N.E. under double reefed topsails collected light again Latter made all sail out steared South so ends Lat 18.06 Long 115.19
 Monday 19th commences with light breeze from East steering West Middle part lay to heathered to the N.E. Latter steared N.E. and N.W. Lat 18.00 Long 115.00
 Tuesday 20th fine steering N. with all sail out Middle and Latter parts very light breeze saw grassy passer steering N. so ends Lat 18.14 East Long 115.19
