 E. & E. at 2 P.M. saw the Whales to the wind
 again lowered the boats but never saw them more at
 sunset took up the boats Middle all sail standing
 to the E. & E. at 12 o'clock took ship Latter part at 10
 A.M. took to the E. & E. again so ended Lat 15.45 Long 115.47
 Monday 30th Commenced with light breezes from E. & E.
 at 1 P.M. took to the South at 2 P.M. saw breaches
 at a great distance saw nothing more of them Middle
 part the same Latter part at 8 P.M. took to E. & E.
 at 9 A.M. breeze on strong tack in top galant sails so by
 weather so ends Lat 14.15 S Long 116.02 East
 Tuesday 1st First part strong breeze from S.E. steering
 N.E. at 8 P.M. took ship to the S.E. Middle part
 the same Latter part at the main sail and main
 top galant sail steered N.W. Lat 14.15 S Long 115.34 East
 Wednesday October 2nd Commenced with strong winds
 from S.E. steering to the E. & E. at 8 P.M. shorten
 for the night Middle weather the same Latter part
 standing to the E. & E. Lat 14.15 S Long 116.03 East
 Thursday 3rd Commenced with fresh breezes from S.E.
 standing to the E. & E. at 6 P.M. shorten sail for night
 Middle the same Latter all sail out steering West
 so ends Lat 14.11 S Long 115.09 East
 Friday 4th First part fine weather steering West at 6 P.M.
 shorten sail for the night Middle part Lay to Latter
 steered West so ends Lat 14.00 S Long 114.09 E.
 Saturday 5th Fine weather steering West Middle
 Lay to Latter part steered West at 11 P.M. bent the
 fore sail so ends Lat 13.38 S Long 112.09
 Sunday 6th First part fine weather steering West
 at 6 P.M. spoke the Box Blower of London 20 miles
 Out 800 bbls Middle standing to the S.W. Latter
 the same all sail out Lat 14.04 S Long 112.00 East
 Monday 7th Fine weather standing to the southwest
 Middle and Latter parts weather the same at 7 P.M.
 took ship to East so ends Lat 14.31 S Long 111.46 E.

 E. & E. with all sail out saw nothing Middle took in fore
 and main top galant sails fly jib Latter all sail out
 so end heading up E. by S. Lat 14.47 Long 114.08 East
 Wednesday 9th Fine weather standing to the East with
 all sail out Middle under 3 topsails Latter part a
 light breeze from South Lat 14.50 Long 115.05 East
 Thursday 10th Commenced a calm Middle all sail shrou up
 Latter part the same Lat 14.55 S Long 115.27 East
 Friday 11th Attended with a profound calm Middle
 part a light breeze from S.E. Latter part made all
 sail steering East so ends Lat 14.44 S Long 116.14 E.
 Saturday 12th Light breezes from S.E. steering to
 the East Middle part the at 12 o'clock raised ship to
 the S.E. Latter steered N.W. saw nothing so ends
 this 24 hours Lat 13.50 S Long 115.50 E
 Sunday 13th First part fine weather wind from E. &
 steering N.W. Middle part headed on wind to the
 South under 3 topsails Latter part all sail out steered
 N.W. so ends Lat 13.24 S Long 114.24
 Monday 14th Fresh breezes from South steering N.W.
 Middle under 3 topsails headed to the S.W. Latter part
 all sail out a ship too leeward Lat 13.24 S Long 113.46
 Tuesday 15th Light breezes from South standing to the
 N.W. at 4 P.M. spoke the Clifford Mayne of
 Sandwich 23 months out with 1400 bbls Middle part
 under 3 topsails standing to the East Latter part
 stood to the S.W. with all sail out in company with
 the Clifford Mayne Lat 13.24 S Long 112.06 East
 Wednesday 16th Light breezes from S.E. steering to the
 N.W. Middle headed to the N.E. Latter took
 ship to the S.W. so ends Lat 13.33 S Long 112.06 East
 Thursday 17th Fine weather standing to the S.W. at
 6 P.M. took ship shorten sail for the night
 Middle part strong breezes Latter part all sail
 out standing to the N.E. saw nothing day time saw
 nothing so ends Lat 13.19 S Long 112.58 East
