

Thursday November 7th Commences with fresh breeze at meridian, faster and got three whales and large whale at 2 P.M. took them to the ship got dinner commenced stowing down the oil between decks at 4 P.M. finish at and took to the large whale got his job in and cleared away middle story breeches with passing clouds at daylight call hands and took at 11 o'clock got the large whale in and went to dinner Lat 14.48 Long 115.56

Friday 8th fine weather cut the small whales and commenced boiling middle driving the big ones Latter cut the head in 20 ends Lat 14.58 S Long 116.20 East

Saturday 9th Commences with light breeze and fine weather boiling middle the same Latter part made sail moved ship to the West 20 ends Lat 14.47 Long 116.41 E

Monday 10th commences with strong breeze from S.W. with squally weather at 4 P.M. finish boiling and wash of middle part lay too under a main topsail Latter part set double reefed topsails employed stowing down 20 goat this day Lat 14.45 S Long 115.50 East

Tuesday 11th fine weather wind from S.W. steering to S.E. employed stowing down middle part the Latter stowing headed too westward Lat 14.45 S Long 115.50 East

Wednesday 12th commences with a light breeze from S.E. standing too the West at 3 P.M. saw a sail to the N.W. employed stowing oil middle under double reefed main topsail Latter part stowing at 11 o'clock finish stowing and made steering W.N.W. 20 ends Lat 14.50 S Long 115.39

Thursday 13th commences with fine weather wind from S.W. steering W.N.W. middle part under a main topsail Latter part made all sail steered 20 ends at 11 o'clock spoke the Samuel Enderby of London 26 miles out with 2600 blb 20 ends Lat 14.44 S Long 115.00 East

Friday 14th commences with light breeze and fine weather wind from S.E. steering S.W. middle and Latter parts the same 20 ends Lat 14.26 S Long 114.17 East

Saturday 15th commences with moderate breeze from S.E. with fine weather steering S.W. middle under a main topsail double reefed Latter all sail out steered S.E. 20 ends Lat 13.58 S Long 113.5

Remarks Saturday November 16th commences with moderate breeze and fine weather steering S.E. saw a sail to the North middle under a close reefed main topsail Latter all sail out steering S.W. 20 ends Lat 13.41

Sunday 17th commences with strong breezes from S.E. steering W.N.W. with all sail out at 5 P.M. passed the Samuel Enderby of London standing to East middle under double reefed main topsail Latter part made sail steering W.N.W. Lat 13.12 Long 113.44

Monday 18th commences with strong breezes from S.E. steering W.N.W. middle part under double reefed main topsail Latter part strong topsail and courses at 8 o'clock saw a shoal of whales at 11 o'clock lowered boats whales going to the North 20 ends Lat 13.00 Long 113.00

Tuesday 19th strong breezes in pursuit of the whales at 1 P.M. struck and got one 40 blb whale at 5 P.M. took on got head of and body in and set the watch at daylight took in the head made sail light breeze from S.E. standing to the S.E. saw breeches to windward 20 ends Lat 12.45 S Long 112.5

Wednesday 20th light breezes from S.E. steering S.E. employed boiling middle part under main topsail and fore sail Latter finish boiling and wash of all sail out standing to the West saw a finback 20 ends Lat 12.50 S Long 114.15

Thursday 21st commences with light breezes from South steering to the Westward at 3 P.M. took ship to East middle took in light sails Latter all sail out at 1 P.M. took ship to the West 20 ends Lat 12.33 S Long 114.14

Friday 22nd commences with fine weather and a fine breeze from South at 3 P.M. took ship to the S.E. middle all sail set Latter the same at 11 o'clock saw a large whale to windward got dinner and took ship 20 ends this day Lat 12.44 S Long 115.12 E

Saturday 23rd at meridian lowered the fore and main masts by all appearance had been struck and had iron in him he had but one rising in side of the ship after the boats lowered at 4 took up the fore middle and Latter the same Lat 12.58 S Long 115.2 E
