

Ship *Yoring Phenix* from the *Coco*
Remarks on Board Thursday December 26th 1839.

Commences with a light breeze from E. by S. steering West
per compass with all drawing sail set Middle part very
light air Latter the same Lat 25.45 Long 58.35 East
Friday 27th Commences with very light and baffling air
from East steered W. by S. per compass Middle part
got a fine breeze from E. by S. Latter the same all drawing
sail to advantage Lat 25.54 S Long by Chron 58.25 E

Saturday 28th Commences with fine whole sail breeze from
from East steering W. by S. with all sail set Middle part
overcast weather Latter clear with passing clouds so
good this day Lat 26.14 S Long per Chron 58.18 E

Sunday 29th Commences with a fresh breeze from East
steering West per compass with all sail set weather overcast
Middle the same Latter very strong so ends this day
Lat 27.14 S Long per Chron 58.51 E

Monday 30th attends with a very strong trade from East
steering W. per compass at 6 A.M. took in royal steering
at 5 took top galant standing sails Middle heavy breeze
Latter part clear with strong winds from E. by S. so ends
this day Lat 28.33 S Long by Chron 43.28 E

Tuesday 31st Commences with fine breeze with rather
smoothly with a heavy sea running Middle part at a squall
from S.W. stands back got the standing sails in and down
top close reefed top sails headed W. by N. Latter part
heavy rain at 11 clear up a little set the jib and spanker
so ends Lat 28.43 S Long 42.15 East

Wednesday January 1st attends with a fresh gale
from S.W. by S. Steer with passing clouds at 3 P.M. set
the main sail and whole top sails at 4 set top galant sail
Middle part at 12 o'clock took in top galant sails strong
breezes Latter the same at 9 A.M. a man died by
Name of Joel West after being of duty a week with
the *Savoy* so ends Lat 29.56 S Long per Chron 39.52 E

Thursday 2nd strong winds from S.W. steering to W. by N. per
Compass under top sails and courses at 4 P.M. committed the corpse
to the deep Middle light and baffling Latter the same light
from the N.E. saw wright whale's bats Lat 29.10 Long 38.39 E

Islands towards the Cape Good Hope

Remarks Friday January 3rd commences with light baffling air
from N.E. headed to the S.W. saw abundance of wright whale
bats Middle and Latter the same very little wind hot sun
and very warm Lat 28.55 Long by Chron 38.24 East

Saturday 4th attends with a calm at 5 P.M. got a light
from S.E. headed up S.W. by W. sent up royal yards and set
the royals Middle very light and baffling Latter a fine
breeze from N.E. steered W. by S. so ends Lat 29.22 Long 37.18

Sunday 5th attends with fine breeze and fine weather wind
from N.E. employed repairing the main sail 3 o'clock finish
and bent it Middle part the same Latter moderate the
Barometer falling so ends Lat 29.14 Long per Chron 37.38 E

Monday 6th Commences with moderate breezes from N.E. with
smokey weather Barometer still falling at 1 P.M. took in
standing sails and royals and top galant sail smooth calm
and overcast clouds rising from the S.W. Middle part
at 9 P.M. lightning all round at 2 A.M. wind comes from
South strong double reefed. thick and raining at 5 A.M.
clear of Barometer rising Latter with passing
clouds and strong breezes headed up W. per compass so
ends this day Lat 31.30 S Long per Chron 33.47 E

Tuesday 7th Commences with a fresh breeze from South
steering W. by S. per compass at 1 P.M. set the main royal
Middle part from 11 to 3 A.M. calm Latter a light
breeze from S.E. headed W. by S. with all drawing sail
set Lat 32.18 S Long per Chron 32.00

Wednesday 8th attends with light from S.E. headed up
W. by S. and W. by N. per compass with all sail set weather
fine Barometer at 30 inches 10 hundredths Middle part mostly
calm Latter at 10 A.M. got a light breeze from East
2 sails in set Bowed to the N.E. at 11 A.M. sent out
standing sails low and a lofted steered W. by S. per compass
Barometer fell 10 hundredths so ends Lat 32.00 Long 31.11 E

Thursday 9th Commences with a fine breeze from East
steering W. by S. per compass with all drawing sail set
to advantage Middle part strong Latter blowing heavy
gale took in steering sails and royals at 11 A.M. moderated
a little so ends Lat 34.00 S Long per Chron 28.20 E
