

Ship *Young Phoenix* toward the Cape
 Friday January 10th Commences with fresh breeze from
 E. & S. but moderating fast at 2 P.M. hauld in to W.
 standing to the South at 4 P.M. tack ship headed up
 N.W. weather clear with passing clouds Middle part
 moderate breeze from W.S.W. headed up & W. lightning in the
 N.E. but clear overhead Latter part baffling & S.W. with a
 tremendous sea rowling from S.W. at 11 A.M. got a light air
 from S.E. steered W.S.W. for compass found the current setting
 strong to the W.S.W. found ship set S.W. by W. 4 miles in 24
 hours so ends Lat 34.26 S. Long by Chron 26.40 West
 Saturday 11th Commences with baffling air from S.E. with large
 sea rowling from S.W. so very high that it often broke head the
 appearance of a reef at 6 P.M. saw the low of the Land bearing
 N. per compass Middle baffling air from all points of the compass
 with squalls of rain Latter got a breeze from W.S.W. headed up
 N.W. the ship set W.S.W. 4 miles so ends with a tremen-
 dous sea bearing from the S.W. Lat 34.58 S. Long by Chron 24.17 E.
 Sunday 12th Commences with moderate breeze from W.S.W.
 with clear weather headed up & W. water discolored at 4 P.M.
 come up W.S.W. very light set royals at 6 P.M. sounded got near
 bottom with a 100 fathoms at 8 P.M. wind out East set studding
 sails steering W.S.W. Barometer at 30 and 30 hundredth Middle
 a fine breeze from East studding sails low and aloft Latter part
 the same Barometer falling only found the help of about 7 miles
 to the West current so ends Lat 35.10 S. Long per Chron 21.47 E.
 Monday 13th Commences with a light E. & S. winds steering
 W.S.W. at 4 P.M. a calmer at 6 a breeze from E. & W. in studding
 sail and royals Middle breezing on topgalant in at 5 A.M.
 double reefed the topsails took in jib and spankers and main
 sails headed S.W. from 5 P.M. till 9 saw amense numbers of
 sun fish rowling on the surface of the water struck one
 out of the Larboard quarter boat the iron screw and we lost
 him so ends at 10 A.M. veered ship headed up & W.
 Lat 36.14 S. Long 21.26 E.
 Tuesday 14th A strong gale from W. headed & S.W. from 12 too
 4 P.M. passed hundreds of sun fish struck one out of the boat
 and saved him they appear too fear of the edge of the Bunk at 4 P.M.
 set the jib Middle at 3 A.M. a calmer Latter part the same at 10 A.M.
 sounded found 70 fathoms shoals and coral Lat 36.43 S. Long per Chron 20.38 East

of Good Hope on the 18th Anchored in Table Bay
 Wednesday January 15th Commences with a calmer a tremendous
 swell rowling from N.W. at 4 P.M. sounded the same depth of
 water and bottom the same Middle light airs from S.E.
 steering N.W. Latter part a fine breeze weather settled
 Barometer 30 inches 20 hundredth so ends Lat 35.30 S. Long per Chron 39
 Thursday 16th Fine weather wind from S.E. steering & W. M.
 with per compass at 4 P.M. saw Cape Agulhas bearing E.
 Middle steered & S.W. till 12 sounded 100 fathoms mud
 from 10 to 2 steered & S. at 2 A.M. lifted too with heads & yards
 aback at 4 past 4 capt of saw the Cape good Hope being
 N.W. steered for it at meridian of green point
 becalmed with a Bark and a Churner the same so
 ends this 24 hours Lat
 Friday 17th Commences with a strong gale of the Table Mountain
 the Mountain sunerlope with wolly clouds rowling of
 like pieces of wood close reefed and beat up to the ship
 but blowed on so tremendously that it was imposable for
 anchors to bring a ship up hoid up and run under lee
 of Table Mountain Middle part gaving round and round
 under the lee of Table Mountain at 12 mountain clear of
 at daylight made sail went in at 4 A.M. came to in 8 fathoms
 of water sent down topgalant yard and royal yard and met
 so ends got of fresh meat and Vegetables
 Saturday 18th Commences with fine weather light
 breezes employed cleaning ship Latter strong S.E. wind
 so ends this day
 Sunday 19th Commences with fiery southeaster at 7
 A.M. let go the Larboard Anchor at 8 the ring of the
 Anchor broke at 10 very heavy gusts of winds at 4 P.M.
 more moderate Latter part strong winds from
 S.E. & S. Larboard watch on liberty lying in the
 outer anchorage. Ship Mains of Enchance 17th
 all full Bahnd home in few days
 Monday 20th Light sootherly winds at 8 A.M. swept
 for the Anchor at 10 took it to the bows Latter part
 employed getting out the pump and making preparations
 for painting sent on shore 4 cask for water so ends
 this day
