

Ship Young Phoenix from the  
 Meringue on Board Sunday March 15<sup>th</sup> 1840  
 First part attends with a heavy gale from N.W. steering  
 by the wind to the West by S. under close reefed topsails  
 fore sail and reefed mainsail at 4 P.M. moderate  
 set jib and spanker Middle made all sail headed  
 up 11 h. S. Latter sent up royal yards set the royals wind  
 hauled in to S. and died to a calm with a heavy swell  
 running from N.W. so ends Lat 29.30 N Long 70.19 W  
 Monday 16<sup>th</sup> Commences with a calm at 4 P.M.  
 got a breeze from S.W. steering N.W. with all  
 drowing sail set Middle hauled in to S.W. by 11 h. breeze  
 on strong took in steering sails fore and main topsails  
 Latter strong breeze but clear saw a brig standing  
 to the South at 11 h. set fore topgalant sail so ends  
 this 24 hours Lat 30.30 N Long per Chron 67.50 W  
 Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> Commences with a strong breeze from  
 N.W. steering N.W. at 1 P.M. set the main topgalant sail  
 Middle part set the main royal Latter part breeze  
 on at 10 h. took in topgalant sail at 11 double reefed  
 sent down royal yards blowing strong so ends this  
 24 hours Lat 30.30 N Long per Chron 67.45 W  
 Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> Commences with a strong gale from  
 N.W. steering N.W. at 4 P.M. moderated a little  
 turn and reef out of the main Middle at 10 P.M. died  
 away made sail at 3 h. hauled in to the N.E. Latter breeze  
 up and carried in to S.E. all sail set. Studing sails low and  
 aloft so ends Lat 31.23 N Long 70.40 W  
 Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> Commences with moderate breezes from S.E.  
 steering N.W. at 4 P.M. thick and rainy Middle at 8 P.M.  
 thunder and lightning took in steering sails light and baling  
 threw the night Latter part baling so ends Lat 31.18 N Long 71.00 W  
 Friday 20<sup>th</sup> Commences with a moderate breeze from S.E. steering  
 N.W. with all sail out Middle part rainy with thunder and  
 lightning at 6 h. wind carried in at S. cleared of Latter  
 part blowing strong standing West saw a sail steering  
 S.W. blowing a strong gale with clear weather under double  
 reefed topsails and jib and courses so ends  
 Lat 35.41 N Long per Chron 72.40 W

Cape of Good-Hope towards New Bedford  
 Saturday March 21<sup>st</sup> Commences with a strong gale  
 from N.W. steering by the wind to the N.E. at 4 P.M.  
 headed up 11 h. S. Middle part the same Latter moderate  
 all sail out headed up N.W. so ends Lat 36.10 N Long 73.24 W  
 Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> Commences with light breezes from N.W. steering  
 N.W. by 11 h. with all drowing sail set at 4 P.M. got threw the  
 Gulf stream Middle part rainy at 11 P.M. cleared of wind  
 from North breeze on took topgalant sails and double reefed  
 the topsails standing to the S.E. at 5 h. S. Latter moderate  
 to N.W. blowing heavy thermometer at 41 sharp air Latter  
 moderated a little set single reefed topsail so ends this  
 twenty four hours Lat 36.54 N Long per Chron 73.28 W  
 Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> Commences with strong breezes from N.W. steering  
 at 3 P.M. moderated made all sail at 4 P.M. headed up  
 N.W. saw 2 ships standing to the South 4 P.M. very light  
 Middle part very light Latter part a light breeze  
 from S.E. with overcast weather heading to the N.E. at 8  
 employed getting out the anchors Lat 37.36 N  
 Long by Do 73.40 W  
 Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> Commences with a whole sail breeze from  
 S.E. steering N.E. by S. Middle part thick weather  
 blowing strong at 11 h. took in reefed sails at 2 h.  
 set single reefed topsails and topgalant heading up N.E. at 6  
 at 6 h. saw a brig standing to the N.E. at 8 h. S. sail  
 in site 3 standing to the N.E. and 2 for S.W. wind from  
 S.E. at 9 h. S. sun shone threw the fog got a 11th  
 found the ship 30 miles to the Westward of account  
 sounded had 17 fathoms of water judge ourselves of  
 Gr. Egg Harbor 11 p.m. took ship headed up S.E. by S.  
 made all sail barometer at 29 inches 08 lines and still  
 falling at 11 sounded had 20 fathoms breezing on sent  
 down royal mast barometer at 29 inches and 20 lines  
 weather very thick of fog after meridian moderate  
 a little but thick of fog with a tremendous swell  
 so ends Lat by D. 38.50 N  
 Long by Chron - 74.19 West
