

Ship Young Phoenix from New Bedford

Remarks on Board Sunday June 8th 1840

A fine breeze from S.W. with smooth weather steering E by S. per compass with all drawing sail set to best advantage standing sails low and aloft Middle Barometer at 30 inches 2 tenths Thermometer at 83 at Evening at 4 P.M. shot in foggy latter part light breeze and thick as possible Lat by account 41.50 Long by 52.14

Monday 9th Commenced with breezes from S.W. thick of fog steering E by S. per compass with all sail set Barometer at 29.75 lines Thermometer at 55 air and water Middle part at 12 o'clock the water at 43. very thick of fog at 2 P.M. water at 47. Latter part at 4 P.M. air and water at 47. at meridian air at 51 water 52. light breeze from S.W. steering E by S. so ends Lat by account 41.50 Long by 52.14

Tuesday June 9th Commenced with light breeze from W. S. W. fog lighted up but overcast weather steering E by S. per compass with all sail set at 4 P.M. saw a ship ahead steering E by S. Barometer 30 inches 10 line Thermometer 59 in water 52 air Middle part thick of fog at 4 P.M. saw the ship hull down astern at 5 P.M. wind hauled in to S. E. braces up short by the wind weather overcast with light squalls of rain so ends Lat by account 42.00 Long by 52.00

Wednesday 10th Commenced with strong breezes from S. E. with overcast weather steering by the wind to the S. E. at 4 P.M. came in to S. E. cleared of course up East saw a brig to windward steering to Westward Middle part came up East at 4 P.M. passed brig standing to Westward Latter part wind hauled in to S. set standing sails and royals strong breezes steering East per compass so goes this 24 hours Lat by account 42.17 Long by 52.20

Remarks Thursday 11th Commenced with strong breezes from North with overcast weather steering East per compass with all drawing sail set at 3 P.M. passed a brig standing to the west Barometer at 29.90 lines Thermometer 59. Middle part blowing strong took in topgallant standing sails and royals Latter part moderate set them again so ends Lat 44.12 Long per Chron 37.33 West

Friday 12th Commenced with light breezes from W. S. W. with clear weather steering E by S. per compass wind becoming light but Barometer not rising at 29.65 line at 5 P.M. a calm at 4 passed a dead group of ships Middle part at 9 P.M. a breeze from East headed up S. E. C. rainy wind carried to the North came up 8 P.M. Latter part came up E by S. set royals so ends Lat 44.15 Long 35.13 East

Saturday 13th Commenced moderate breeze from S. W. with clear weather steering E by S. per compass with all drawing sail set at 4 saw a ship to the South steering to the S. W. Middle part at 8 P.M. wind hauled to the Eastward and squally took in topgallant standing sails at 12 o'clock set topgallant and royal standing sails wind from West by S. looking fine and clear with a steady breeze at 7 P.M. set the main skysail Latter part a fine whole sail breeze with good weather Barometer 29.90 Thermometer 59 so ends this day Lat 44.53 Long per Chron 36.17 West

Sunday 14th Commenced with a fine breeze and good weather wind West steering East by S. per compass with all drawing sail set to advantage Middle part at 12 o'clock wind at S. W. rainy took in royal standing sails Latter part blowing strong at 10 P.M. took in lower standing sail and set the jibbs at 11 took in the fly jib and topgallant standing thick and rainy Barometer 29.40 and falling fast Lat by account 45.25 Long by 37.17 West
