

Ship Young Phoenix of New Bedford

Monday August 24th commences with moderate breeze from N.W. by W. with pleasant weather heading up S.W. per compass saw a large ship steering to the Eastward Middle part at 2 P.M. wind hauled to the W.S.W. tack to the N.W. S.W. Latter part light breezes and fine weather wind from the W.S.W. with a smooth sea so ends this twenty four hours

Tuesday 25th commences with moderate breezes from W.S.W. with fine weather and a smooth sea steering to the N.W. Barometer at 30.5 Middle part weather the same Latter part rather a breezing and overcast weather came up at 4 P.M. to give the twenty four hours

Wednesday 26th commences with a fresh breeze from S.W. with smoky weather at 4 P.M. squally took in top galant sail and fly jib Middle part wind came in to East with thick weather with light winds Latter part the same set studding sail fore and a left

Thursday 27th commences with hailing airs from East steering to the West at 4 P.M. hauled in to the W.S.W. tack to the S.W. saw a brig to seaward with the fore topmast gene main top galant mast and jib boom standing to the South under courses and maintop sail Middle part

Barometer at 29.75 at 11 P.M. took ship to the W.S.W. wind from S.W. at 1 P.M. took in top galant sail at 4 thick and squally double reefed Latter the same very squally under single reefed topsails

Friday 28th commences with a strong gale from W.S.W. at 3 P.M. double reefed at 4 P.M. well on, took part the main and close reefed at a pop & veered ship headed up S.W. saw 2 Barks steering East Middle part calmed in to East steered West per compass Latter part all sail put so ends this day

From Gothenburg towards New Bedford.

Saturday 29th August commences with fine whole sail breeze from North with good weather steering West per compass with all mowing sail set studding sails fore and aft passed a brig steering to the W.S.W. in 4 hours out of site Eastern Barometer standing at 30.15 Middle part calmed in to East with clear weather Latter part set royal studding on both sides steering West per compass so ends

Sunday 30th commences with strong winds from E.N.E. with overcast weather steering West per compass at 3 P.M. strong took in royal studding sail down a brig steering W.S.W. per compass under topsails and courses Barometer at 30.15 and falling fell 7 lines the last 12 hours Middle part breezing on at 4 P.M. took in royals and top galant studding sail at 5 P.M. took in top galant sails and topmast studding sails at 7 P.M. passed a chumey looking too on the Banks suppose to be a fisherman at a pop & jib sheet parted split the jib and stored him close down the topsails and double reefed them wind from about North squally reefed the main sail at midnight passed a brig steering West by N. under double reefed main topsails and fore sail so ends

Monday 31st commences with fresh gale from North steering West S.W. per compass weather moderate took in reef out of the main sail Barometer on the rise Middle cleared of fine weather all sail steered W.S.W. per compass Latter part the same set royal studding sail so ends

Tuesday 1st September commences with pleasant breezes N.E. & E. with fine weather steering W.S.W. per compass with all mowing sail set Middle part saw a large ship steering to the S.E. at 4 P.M. calmed & very light Latter part a calm so gives this day
