Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the N heading E by N all sail set middle and latter part the same so ends

Friday March 7 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the N W steering N E all sail is middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat 32° 02 S Long 178° 31 E

Saturday March 8 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the W W W steering N E all sail set middle and latter part the same so ends

Lat 31° 18 S Long 179° 22 W

Sunday March 9 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S W steering N E by E all sail set at sunset took in sail at daylight kept of N E by E and made all sail then French rock in sight

Lat 31° 18 S Long 178° 19 W

Monday March 10 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the N W steering N E by E all sail set at sunset took in sail at daylight made all sail and kept of N E by E the watch employed in braking out the main hatch way

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S W steering N E by E all sail set middle and latter part the same

Lat S Long W

Wednesday March 12 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and squally winds from the N heading S E middle and latter part the same

Thursday March 13 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the N at 2 P.M. the wind howled to the S S W steering N E by E all sail set middle and latter part the same so ends

Friday March 14 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S W steering N E by E all sail set middle and latter part the same

Lat 29° 10 S Long 171° 44 W

Saturday March 15 1851

Those 24 hours begins with calm middle and latter part light breezes from the N E heading E all sail set
