 Lat 24-25 S Long 158 00 112

Sunday March 30 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong
 breezes from the W heading N W by N
 Middle and latter part the same so ends
 The land in sight Lat S Long 112

Monday March 31 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes
 and squally under double reefed topsails
 Middle and latter part more moderate
 so ends Lat S Long 112

Tuesday April 1 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes
 and squally keeping too heading to the east
 at 1 h of W the wind from the E at
 sunset made the land S. E. by N Middle
 and latter part the same so ends
 Lat S Long 112

Wednesday April 2 1851
 At 1 P.M. the Capt went on shore
 at the boat returned at 7 A.M. went on
 shore for water

Thursday April 3 1851
 at 1 P.M. returned with the weather and made
 it away at 5 the boat went on shore
 for the Capt but did not return latter
 part calm and rainy so ends
 Lat S Long 112

Friday April 4 1851
 winds from the E S E beating up to the
 town the boat has not returned at 7
 P.M. the boat returned with the Capt
 stood of shore at 11 tucked in at 7 A.M. the
 boats went on shore for recruits

Saturday April 5 1851
 at 1 P.M. the boats returned loaded
 discharged and went on shore returned
 at 4 discharged and 1 boat went home
 The Capt at sunset returned and kept of
 N N W all sail set Middle and latter
 part the same so ends
 Lat S Long 112

Sunday April 6 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with calms
 Middle and latter part the same so ends
 Lat 19-56 S Long 159 12 112

Monday April 7 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with light breezes
 from the W heading N N W all sail set
 Middle and latter part the same the island
 of whitehead in sight so ends
 Lat S Long 112
