 middle and latter part the same so ends
 Lat 40° 48' N Long E

Thursday May 16 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes
 and rainey from the S.W. ~~steering~~ steering
 N.W. W middle and latter part from the
 N.W. heading N.N.E. hoove too under a
 close reef main topsail so ends
 Lat N Long E

Friday May 17 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong gales
 from the N.W. heading N.N.E. lay in too
 middle and latter part the same so ends
 Lat 42° 09' N Long E

Saturday May 18 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong gales
 from the N.W. heading N. hoove too
 middle and latter part more moderate
 Lat N Long E

Sunday May 19 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with light breezes
 from the N.W. heading N. under double
 reef topsails at 3 P.M. hild a ~~de~~ boy
 middle part the same latter part strong
 breezes from the S.E. steering N.W. by N
 the main top galantail set so ends
 Lat 42° 24' N Long E

Monday May 20 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the
 S.E. steering N.W. by N at 6 P.M. took in the main
 to sail at 8 the mizen topsail at 2 am took in
 the fore topsail at 11 lost the S Boat ~~at~~
 so ends Lat N Long E

Tuesday May 21 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong
 breezes and rainey from the S.E. at 3 P.M.
 set the fore topsail steering N.W. W
 middle and latter part the same so ends
 Lat N Long E

Wednesday May 22 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes
 from the S.W. steering N.W. W under
 double reef fore and main topsails and
 foresail middle and latter more moderate set the
 main top galantail so ends
 Lat 50° 48' N Long 170° 35' E

Thursday May 23 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes
 from the S.W. steering S by W at sunset
 too in sail and left too at daylight strong
 breezes latter part more moderate so ends
 Lat 52° 23' N Long 171° 43' E

Friday May 24 1851
 Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes
 from the N.W. ~~steering~~ heading N at 1 P.M.
 made sail at 5 am the wind hauled to the
 S steering N.N.W. thick fog so ends
 Lat N Long E
