Thursday May 24. 1851

Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the S steering N N W at 4 P.M. took in the fore and ~~main~~ mizen topsails and foresail and close reef the main topsail at 10 am set the foresail 10 ends

Lat 53° 39' N Long 174° 33' E

Sunday May 25 1851

Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S E steering N N E at 1 P.M. kept of at 4 saw right whales lowered two boats but got nothing at sunset kept too to the E under close reef maintopsail and foresail middle and latter part the S 10 ends

Lat 54° 30' N Long 174° 33' E

Monday May 26 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S W steering N N E at 2 P.M. saw whales lowered the 2 boats got nothing at 4 lowered the boats one boat got fast and the iron drownd middle and latter part the same Lat 55° 14' N Long 174° 15' E

Tuesday May 27 1851

Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the S W steering N by W under double reef topsails middle and latter part the same at 4 am lowered the boats for whales got nothing 10 ends Lat N Long E

Wednesday May 28 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and calm steering N N W middle and latter part light breeze and a thick smother at 10 am saw whales lowered the boats got nothing 10 ends These 24 hours

Lat 57° 25' N Long 173° 55' E

Thursday May 29 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the N W heading N N E middle and latter part pleasant a ship in sight boating 10 ends

Lat 58° 20' N Long 174° 33' E

Friday May 30 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S W steering N by E all sail set 5 P.M. spoke the William West fairhaven 7 months out 180 barrels 18 30 S middle and latter part winds from S steering N N E 10 ends

Lat 59° 30' N Long 174° 33' E

Saturday May 31 1851

Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes from the E steering N N E all sail set middle and latter part the same at 2 P.M. saw the land the N E part of Asia at 5 tackd of shore in company with the W.M. wait 10 ends

Lat 60° 40' N Long 174° 33' E

Sunday June 1 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the S E heading E by S all sail set middle and latter part a snow storm at 10 am tackd in shore Lat N Long E

Monday June 2 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes from the E at 4 P.M. wind ship of shore light wind and rainey sea and latter part the same 10 ends

Those 24 hours begins with light winds from the N W heading N by E thick fog middle and latter part the same 10 ends
