Those 24 hours begins with light and thick fog at 6 AM saw 2 bowheads 2 sail in sight middle and latter part the same at 10 AM saw 3 bowheads lowered the boats got nothing

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and thick fog middle and latter clear at 7 AM saw bowheads lowered the boats got nothing 2 sails in sight

Those 24 hours begins with moderate breezes in the ice 3 sails in sight middle and latter part the same

Saturday June 21 1851

all hands employed in chasing bowheads got nothing 7 sails in sight middle and latter part the same chasing bowheads

Sunday June 22 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes the land ice and 5 ships in sight middle and latter part the same so ends those 24 hours

Monday June 23 1851

Those 24 hours begins with strong breezes 5 ships and the land in sight middle and latter part the same more moderate 8 ships in sight

Tuesday June 24 1851

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and foggy 4 ships in sight middle and latter part the same

Wednesday June 25 1851

Moderate breezes 8 ships in sight in sight one a cutting middle and latter part the same going

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and foggy 5 ships in sight so ends

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes 4 ships in sight 1 boiling and one cutting middle and latter strong breezes and foggy so ends

Those 24 hours begins with light breezes and foggy 2 ships in sight at 3 PM saw a bowhead lowered the boats got nothing middle and latter part the same so ends

light breezes and foggy nothing in sight middle part clear 11 ships in sight latter part foggy 1 ship boiling
