Saturday July 26 1851
Thurs 24 hours begins with light breezes 2
native boats come along side a 9 B.M. anchored
in St Lawrence bay

Death Friday August 1 1851
at 6 am got underway to go to sea in Lucie
The topsails a man fell from the main top sail
yard and struck on the chain cable and the
lived one hour at 10 cast anchor
the next day Saturday we berried him
Lat 64° 30' N Long 170 NW

Friday August 8 1851
begins with light breezes at 9 am got
under way from St Lawrence Bay in company
with 17 ships so ends

Saturday August 9 1851
begins with light winds from the W
steering E all sail set middle and latter part
foggy Lat N Long NW
