of New Bedford middle and latter part moderate
with rain Lat N Long

begins with light breezes and rain
steering SE under shorter sail middle
and latter part the same

Friday December 5 1851
begins with light variables and rain
middle latter part the same

Saturday December 6 1851
begins with variable winds and rain
all sail set middle part strong breeze

Sunday December 7 1851
begins with strong breezes from the SE
steering E under shorter sail middle and
latter fine weather all sail set at 11 AM
saw whales lowered the boats got nothing

Monday December 8 1851
begins with light breezes from the SE
steering SE all sail set middle and latter
part the same at 11 AM saw 4 whales lowered
the boats got three so ends
Lat N Long

Tuesday December 9 1851
at 5 PM took them along side at daylight
commenced cutting so ends
Lat N Long

Wednesday December 10 1851
at 5 PM finished cutting and commenced
boiling so ends
Lat N Long

Thursday December 11 1851
begins with light breezes and calm all
hands employed in boiling so ends
Lat 1-46 N Long

Friday December 12 1851
begins with light breezes and calm
at 5 PM finished boiling middle and
latter part the same

Saturday December 13 1851
begins with light breezes middle
and latter part the same all hands
employed in storing down 45 b 50

begins with light breezes middle and
latter part the same
