Sat day 14 th	begins with light airs and pleasant weather so end this day	Fri day 21 th	begins with Calms and great heat all hands employed in setting up the Rigging. Rone then Langhans and Carpenter boring up the masts 3 sails in sight so ends this day
Sun day 15 th	Strong breezes and fine weather at 6 P.M. St Antony bore N.E. distance 40 miles and at 4 P.M. past a brig standing the same way a Lat 14-21 Long 21-29 W	Sat day 22 th	Commences with light airs and very abt weather saw black fish and bore 3 boats and struck 3 and saw one to the Starboard but its being the first oil they we have got since we left home Sweet home at 6 P.M. parted the topsail sent down the gaff and commence making a new one the old one being to short no obs to day
Mo day 17 th	through the day light airs and pleasant weather at 10 o'clock saw a sail ahead all hands employed in steering the Spasser Course South Lat 13-35	Sun day 23 th	begins with strong breezes and heavy weather better part calm and more rain saw a sail to east wa nothing more to day
Tu day 18 th	begins with light airs and heavy nothing seen to day or as yet better part fair at 8 P.M. saw a sail standing to N.W. Lat 11-49 Long by Gunner obs 24-14 and by Chronometer 24-13	Mo day 24 th	through the day strong breezes from S.S.W. heading to the S.E. no obs to day
We day 19 th	first part of these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant weather at 1 P.M. saw beached 1 point on the weather bow of hauld up for them and see saw them once more 4 points to the windward several sails in sight Lat 10-46	Tu day 25 th	begins with pleasant weather wind from S.S.W. at 6 P.M. saw a sail standing to the S.E. Lat 7-59 W
Th day 20 th	through the day calm sever sails in sight nothing more Lat 10-38
