Sa May 16 th	First part of these 24 hours calm and fine weather saw a great number of fin back S ^W ends this day	We May 18 th	begins with heavy gales and unpleasant weather still unable to boil better part more moderate at 6 P ^m begin to boil so wind from S ^W no abs to
Su May 17 th	begins with strong breezes and unpleasant weather at 7 A ^m saw sperm whale and killed 3 boats at 10 A ^m the standard boat got past to a m the whale and killed him the mat got past to him and got captured the whale took to be near spotting blood and the wind blowing heavy at 1 o'clock got past a gain and at 2 P ^m to him to ship and at 3 Commence cutting and at half past 4 finished cutting and made sail 2 wind blowing heavy Lat 24° 30' Long 73° 04'	Th May 21 th	Commences with strong gales and unpleasant weather at 6 P ^m stop boiling wind from S ^W blowing very heavy but 6 casks of oil below Lat 22° 22' Long 74° 04'
		Fri May 22 th	begins with heavy gales from N ^W ship heading S ^W at 8 P ^m beat the hark up the fore top sails stay sail sheet and tore the sail very bad Lat 23° 00' Long 78° 26'
