Su May 24th Commences with heavy
gales from N. S. M. at
2 P. M. tacked Ship and steered
to the S. M. better part
no better no obs to day

Mo May 25th through the day heavy
galls and unpleasant
weather at 10 A. M. wore
Ship and steered to the S. M.
better part no better I am
heart sick of this kind of
winds and weather as I have
not had one days fair wind
for 2 weeks and like to bore
what little blubber I have
got a no obs this day

Tu May 26th begins with strong galls
and unpleasant weather
wind from N. S. M. Ship
heading to the S. M. under
short sail better part
more moderate Commence
biling and at 4 P. M. the after
noon finish and put the
oil below

Lat 49° 18' Long 79° 18'

We May 27th begins with strong breezes
and unpleasant weather
wind from S. M. better part
wind heab to the S. M. tacked
Ship to the S. M.
Lat 49° 33' Long 78° 20'

Th May 28th through the day pleasant
weather and fine breezes
Lat 46° 51' Long 77° 42'

Fr May 29th begins with head winds and
pleasant weather set up
the fore top mast back stays
and rigging wind heab to the
N. S. M. at 10 A. M. saw
whales run over them with
the Ship before they were
seen from a light breeze
& boats with success & men
sick of duty I have got
a miserable crew to get
a voyage with Lat 44° 40'

Sat May 30th begins with pleasant
weather and fine breezes
from N. S. M. course ~~to the~~
S. M. by 1 P. M. Lat 42° 12'
Long 79° 15'

Sun May 31th through the day pleasant
weather sent up the
fore top gallant mast
nothing this day
Lat 40° 24' Long 77° 14'

Mon May 2nd begins with calm
at 2 P. M. bore for
black fish and got
3 to the Ship
Lat 39° 30' Long by lines
alt 76° 19' by Chron. 74° 00'
