begins with light air

hands employed in the duty
of the ship at 4 P.M. saw
black fish and bored 2 boats
and got one to ship
batter part calm and pleas.
Lat 38° 48'

Wed May 4th

begins with Calms and
pleasant weather first part
battered the rib and part of
below nothing more remarkable
Lat 37° 49' Long 77° 04'

Th May 5th

begins with pleasant
weather at 4 A.M. saw
hump back called for
them the Cabard boat
got part but lost him
by the rain breaking
Lat 36° 44' Long

Fri May 6th

begins with strong breezes
and pleasant weather at
1 P.M. saw a large standing
to the N.E. batter part
strong breezes at 11 A.M.
the bolt in the stem broke
Lat 34° 41' Long 74° 34'

Sa May 7th

begins with strong breezes
from N.W. batter part saw
a large standing to the
E.N.E. Lat 34° 04' Long 74° 20'

Sun May 8th

through the day pleasant
weather and fine breezes
Lat 31° 49' Long 76° 38'

Sept
Mon May 9th

Ship Zephyr of 13
begins with strong breezes
from S.E. and pleasant
weather batter part all hands
employed preparing the fore
top sail and other parts of ship
Duty Lat 28° 45' Long 77° 13'

Tue May 10th

through day fine breezes
and pleasant weather
Lat 26° 14' Long 76° 32'

Wed May 11th

begins with pleasant
weather saw black fish
and called for them but
did not get any batter
part pleasant to day
have put the men on a
bounty of bread for wasting
it at 7 pounds per man
with pudding 3 times per week
with as much rice and peas
as they want batter part
pleasant Lat 23° 33'

Th May 12th

begins with pleasant weather
and no whales and employed
mending sails nothing more
to day Lat 20° 34' Long 74° 42'

Fri May 13th

Commences with pleasant
weather but no whales
bent the fore and main
top sails and showed the
new ones below Lat

Sa May 14th

Sent down the mizen top
sail to fitter Men travel tree
as the old one have give
out same mending the
mizen top sail
Lat 18° 33'
