Sun May 14 th	begins with pleasant weather and fine breezes nothing seen to day Lat 16° 14' Long 74° 32'	Sat May 21 th	begins with light airs and pleasant weather 11 gals in the jib boom and fitted the band latter part all hands employed in cleaning ship so ends this day
Mon May 15 th	begins with strong breezes and pleasant weather all hands employed in the duties of the ship Lat 12° 11'	Sun May 22 th	begins with strong breezes and pleasant weather saw the ship ^{and} paragon of New port 26 about 14 hundred lbs reported the loss of the ship miter at 11 PM came to the land 6 miles off latter part calm
Tue May 16 th	through the day strong breezes and unpleasant weather all hands employed in making sails and fitting the mizen top mast and yard and at 4 PM sent up the mizen top mast and bent the fore sail Lat 10° 38'	Mon May 23 th	begins with light airs and pleasant weather all hands employed breaking out casks to fill with water so ends this day
Wed May 18 th	Commences with light breezes and thick weather sent up the mizen top gallant mast and yard no more	Tue May 24 th	at 1 PM came to anchor in Tomlin harbor where I found the ship Nantux a shore and lodged with Capt Mason on shore with every thing out of the ship and had been for 14 days Ship Mankiling Capt Kay Ship Maryestaking & Ship Corica Capt merchant got off water so good
Th May 19 th	begins with light airs and pleasant weather and hands employed in fitting ship a pleasant of pin backs but no sperm whales and at 10 AM made agaya head Lat 6° 14'		
Fri May 20 th	begins with light airs and pleasant weather all hands employed in the duties of the ship Lat 4° 41'
