Lat 30° 40' S

Tue Day 6th begins with strong breezes
and squally ship heading
S.W. by S Lat 11° 41' S
Long 142° 23' west

Wed Day 7th through the day strong
breezes and fair weather
Lat 7° 46' S Long 144° 16'

Th Day 8th through the day strong
trade ship steering
S.W. by S Lat 10° 37' S
Long 146° 18' west

Fri Day 9th Begins with strong breezes
and pleasant weather course
S.W. by S all hands employed
tacking down the rigging
Lat 13° 33' S
Long 148° 30' west

Sat Day 10th light breezes and pleasant
weather all hands employed
in fitting the rigging the
ship remains unwell with
a pain in his side and breast
Lat 16° 16' S Long 140° 16' W

Sun Day 11th first part of the 24 hours fresh
breezes and pleasant weather
better part the same
Lat 18° 09' S Long 142° 40' W

Mon Day 12th Begins with strong gale
and heavy weather starting
W by S at 8 A.M. made
outly a head distance 90
the wind blowing a heavy
gale Lat 18° 48' S Long 146° 12'

Tue Day 13th first part calm and pleasant
weather sent down the
main top sail to be repaired
saw 4 ships sailing off
Karakawa Bay so ends
this day

Wed Day 14th first part light air pleasant
all employed in repairing
the main top sail
nothing seen this day
except ships and then
a beauty of home
Sweet Home there is
no place like Home
be it ever so
