

Ship Zephyr for Japan

Sunday 8th Begins with very light airs and fine weather Henry Guener layed up with his Sinker or Box on pit for duty Henry & Cook still off duty Lat 32° 33' Long by Lunar obs 172° 16' 30" by Chron 171° 48' 30"

Tuesday 9th Begins with Calms weather and a heavy sea on the West in played in the duty of ship Lat 31° 12' Long 172° 48' West

Wednesday 10th first part of these 24 hours light airs and pleasant weather at 4 P.M. took a fine breeze from S.E. Course N. by S. latter part strong gale Lat 31° 24' Long by Chron 176° 26' by Lunar obs 176° 34'

Thursday 11th Begins with fresh breezes and pleasant weather a heavy sea from the Westward Thomas Armstrong layed up with a sore foot Lat 31° 41' Long 179° 26' W

Friday 12th first part of these 24 hours pleasant breezes and fine weather Henry & Cook on duty latter pleasant Lat 31° 30' Long 178° 04' East

April 1844 for Japan

Saturday 13th Through the day fine weather and pleasant breezes from S.E. Course S.S.W. Guener remains off duty Lat 30° 30' Long by Lunar obs 174° 14' E

Sunday 14th Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather latter part wind hauled to S.S.W. Lat 29° 44' Long 173° 23' East

Monday 15th Begins with light airs and pleasant weather latter part strong breezes and unpleasant and rain nothing seen to day Lat 30° 09' 87' Long 172° 44' East

Tuesday 16th first part of these 24 hours, a light airs and pleasant weather saw a fin back going to the windward repaired the foretack sheet and hauled out for the line Lat 29° 41' Long 168° 16' East

Wednesday 17th Commenced with light breezes and pleasant weather no signs of whales and 10 months out with 400 Bbls S.O. Least sick at that Lat 29° 12' Long 166° 11' East

Thursday 18th Begins with moderate breezes and cloudy weather at 4 P.M. wind hauled to S.W. and blew heavy sent down the top gallant yards fore and main top in place and took sail and hauled out main sail latter part moderate still unpleasant
