

Ship Lephyr on Japan

Sun Day 12th



Begins with light airs and pleasant weather at 6 A.M. saw whales to the windward going S.E. did not lower Lat 30° 06'

Mon Day 13th

Begins with light airs and pleasant weather at 10 A.M. saw whales at 11 A.M. the Staked got fast and had to cut by the line being foul and lost the whale Lat 30° 14'

Tue Day 14th



first part of the 24 hours fine weather at 2 P.M. saw whales at 11 P.M. the Boat got fast and at 11 P.M. took the ship S.E. also this day

Wed Day 15th

Begins with light airs and pleasant weather at 10 A.M. spoke the ship Carter Hammond 22 months 1000 lbs. Sperm Lat 30° 11' Long 156° 14' by Chron 177° 16' E

Th Day 16th

Begins with strong gales and unpleasant weather latter part the same Lat 30° 39'

Fri Day 17th

first part of these 24 hours fresh gales saw a ship standing to S.W. under full sail

Lat 30° 32' S

a bit those 6 that been for they she be compassed take boys at the soul

May 1844 Japan

Sat Day 18th

Commenced with strong gales from East took in all sail but close reefed top sails latter part took in the fore and mizen top sails Lat 30° 00'

Sun Day 19th

Begins with strong gales and unpleasant weather at 3 P.M. Commence putting down what Pib was on Deck so that latter part moderate setting to day Lat 29° 49' S

Mon Day 20th

first part of these 24 hours strong breezes and pleasant weather heavy swell from S.E. latter part calm Isaac C. Smith come on board this day Lat 30° 34' S

Tue Day 21st

Begins with Calm and a heavy sea running a great quantity of pin backs seen unbent the fore sail to repair latter part Calm unbent the main sail to repair Lat 30° 14' Long 161° 08' E

Wed Day 22nd

Begins with strong gales and unpleasant weather at 6 P.M. bent the main sail latter part strong gales from S.E. Lat 30° 08' S
