

Ship Zephyr June

Mon May 17th Commences with strong breezes and foggy weather better part the same Lat 30° 45'

Tue May 18th first part of the 24 hours strong gales from S E steering E 8° Lat 30° 44' Long 168° 12'

Wed May 19th Through the day strong gales and unpleasant weather Lat 30° 37' Long 167° 12'

Th May 20th Begins with strong breeze and cloudy weather middle part more moderate and the men complain of bad meat and so forth Lat 30° 47' Long by lunar obs 167° 27' East

Fri May 21st Through the day bright air and pleasant weather Lat 30° 44' S

Sat May 22nd Through the day calm and very warm Lat 30° 35' S Long by lunar obs 167° 48' East

Sun May 23rd Begins with light breezes from west and pleasant weather saw a sail to E S E steering to E better part calm Long by lunar obs 167° 50' East

Mon May 24th Begins with light air and pleasant weather at 10 P M spoke ship Capt. J. L. Hammond better part fine breezes from W Lat 29° 07' S Long by lunar obs 167° 35' E

June 1844 Japan

Tue May 25th first part of these 24 hours fine breezes and pleasant weather and no whales better part strong breezes Lat 29° 13' Long 170° 00' E

Wed May 26th Through the day strong breezes and mainly and no whales Lat 29° 39' S Long by Chron 170° 08' E

Th May 27th Begins with wind from S M ship steering E 8° E heart sick and no whales and have not seen them but once in 44 days Lat 29° 39' S Long 170° 24' East

Fri May 28th Through the day strong breezes and main Lat 29° 44' Long 170° 40' East

Sat May 29th begins with light air and pleasant weather spoke ship Eagle of 15 antler 7 months out 170 lbs and well Lat 29° 44' S

Sun May 30th first part calm and warm at 4 P M spoke the ship heabana Capt. W. A. Chester 32 months out 1500 Sperm all well Lat 29° 48' S Long 170° 12' East

Mon May 31st Begins with light air at 9 P M spoke ship Metaborn New Bedford Lat 29° 36' Long 169° 40'
