

Ship Zephyr on Japan

Sunday 2th

Begins with pleasant breezes from N.E. Ship steering to the N.W. latter part pleasant and N.W. Whales Lat 29° 26' Long by lunar 170° 06' E

Sunday 3th

first part of the 24 hours all hands employed in the ship the ship N.W. Whales latter part calm Lat 30° 06' Long by lunar 169° 22' East

Sunday 4th

first part calm saw a fin back whale and porpoise latter part strong breezes at 11 AM saw steam Whales and lowered 2 boats Lat 30° 19' S

Monday 5th



at 1 PM lowered the other 2 boats the Staker went on and got slight part with a chance for 2 young ones and 3 baby whales lost from my in succession by having a pure good palnatung boat to see at 4 PM the latter part passed to a 4 AM whale and at 1 PM to him to ship at 6 AM commenced cutting and at 10 AM finished Lat 29° 04' Long 170° 00'

Tuesday 6th

Begins with strong breeze and pleasant weather at 9 AM saw a sail to S.E. head to the south Lat 29° 54' S

Wednesday 7th

Commences with strong breezes and steady weather at 9 PM finished hauling latter part strong gales from E.N.E. Lat 29° 07' S

Thursday 8th

Begins with strong gales and rain one man lay up with a sore foot latter part the gale increases ship head to the south N.W. to day

Friday 9th

Begins with strong gales from East with rain at 4 PM part the rib below at 6 PM more ship head to the S.E. latter part unpleasant Lat 30° 19' S

Saturday 10th

first part more moderate and a heavy sea running some employed in repairing the main sail. latter part more moderate at 9 PM saw a ship to S.E. head to the S.E. Lat 30° 01' Long 168° 37' East

Sunday 11th

first part of these 24 hours strong breezes from East at 2 PM made all sail steering to the S.E. a sail in sight to the windward and we near her part latter part spoke the ship Japan of Nantucket 33 months out 1844 bound West Lat 29° 26' S
