of duty Lat 31° 35' S

No obs to day

at 5 AM saw a sail to

North gale blew off

steward remains sick

after being out 10 months
filling them up with salt
water this is hard and not
fair Lat 30° 19' S Long 171°

Begins with light air
and pleasant weather
all hands employed in
breaking out matter and
putting down salt in it
space Steward on duty
Lat 30° 28' S

Through the day light
air and pleasant weather
saw a sail to the SW
Lat 30° 10' Long 171° 42' E

Through the day light
breezes with rain saw
a sail to the westward
Lat 30° 10' Long 172° 40' East
