the waister boat 1 better boat
a saw the island again and
lat by obs 75° Long by Chron 177
160° 02' L by Loran obs 160° 19' m.

and pleasant weather employ-
ed in setting up the head
rigging lat by old 135 Smith

first part of these 24 hours
showing clear and pleasant weather
at 1 pm saw 3 sperm whales at
a distance and struck 2 and saved
3 of them at 4 took them to
ship and commenced cutting
at 6 finished one of them
