Thurs day 1st

Begins with moderate breezes and fine weather Ship laying off and on in want of men got up one Boat load of yarn better part Calm at 8 AM went on shore to get men but did not get any. So ends the Day

Fri day 2nd

first part Calm and pleasant weather at 6 PM the Boat returned on board without any men and at 7 AM went on shore again and there remains there so ends this Day

Sat day 3rd

Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather at 2 PM the got on board with the 4 men that had been away and went up with a crew of 23 men bearing 2 Staves of the same will 3600's better part Calm 2 sail in sight Lat 14° 16' North Long 144° 26' East

Sun day 4th

The Day Begins with pleasant weather turned Robert Zibney to duty better part light airs from E & S Ship heading to the North was one sail in sight to the S.W. Lat 14° 42' S Long 144° 44'

Mon day 5th

Through the Day Strong breezes and unpleasant weather. Saw a sail to the S.E. Lat 16° 31' S Long 144° 09' E

April 1841 S.I.

Sunday 6th

Begins with Strong breezes and pleasant weather Ship heading to the North under double reefed top sails a sail to the windward thought to be the Ship Galen of Newen better part moderate breezes and pleasant weather Lat 15° 15' S Long 144° 17' E

Monday 7th

The Day Begins with light breezes and pleasant weather. Saw 3000's also saw a sail to the S.E. Steering North better part spoke Ship Galen of Newen Capt Bowyer Lat 19° 25' S Long 144° 39' East

Tuesday 8th

Through the Day Light airs and rainy weather wind from S.W. & S Ship heading S.W. No ads to Day

Wednesday 9th

Begins with Strong breezes and pleasant weather. middle part rainy wind from S.W. & S Ship heading S.W. Lat 22° 23' S Long 144° 19' E

Thurs day 10th

first part of these 24 hours pleasant breezes and fine weather Ship heading to the S.W. and S.W. Whales better part Calm saw black fish lower without success Lat 23° 59' S Long 144° 57' E
