

Ship Lebya Japan

Sunday June 7th

first part strong gales with rain from ESE at 11 AM finished hauling N to obs to day

Monday June 8th

through the day strong gales from ESE with rain put out the standard boat and take in the bow boat N to obs to day

Tuesday June 9th

through the day strong gales from S E ship heading to the ESE Lat 29.34 N Long 165.48 E

Wednesday June 10th

first part of these 24 hours strong gales from S E with a heavy sea running at 4 AM hauled the june and main topsails later part more moderate Lat 29.17 N Long 165.57

Thursday June 11th

the day begins with moderate gales from S E with pleasant weather and S W whales better part bright breezes from S E ship heading to the N E Lat 30.24 N

Friday June 12th

first part of these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant weather better part employed stowing down Lat 30.44 N

Saturday June 13th

through the day moderate breezes from S ship heading N E all hands employed cleaning ship Lat 30.48 N Long 164.07 by Lunar 164.51

Sunday June 14th

first part pleasant weather and fine breezes from South better part touched to westward S W signs of whales Lat 30.58 N Long 163.17 E

Monday June 15th

through the day moderate breezes and being Lat 29.13 N Long 163.41

Tuesday June 16th

June 1846 Japan

first part moderate breezes with rain gale of rain broken from boat steiner as it being hit to do that duty planning missed 2 whales and doing other damage to the voyage better part bright breezes and pleasant weather Lat 30.80 N Long 164.28 East

Wednesday June 17th

through the day fresh breezes from South ship heading to Eastward no hope of finding whales as this makes the 12th day that we have gone without seeing any thing at all Lat 30.21 N Long 165.28 E

Thursday June 18th

first part unpleasant weather and rain ship heading S E better part squally at 8 AM saw sperm whales but off and struck one small one to end the day

Friday June 19th

the day begins with pleasant weather boat off at 2 AM took the whales to the ship at 3 commenced cutting and at 4 finished cutting better part employed sailing Lat 30.55 Long 166.16

Saturday June 20th

first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather employed hauling better part calm at 8 AM saw sperm whales but off and struck one small one Lat 30.23

Sunday June 21st

first part employed cutting and at 3 PM saw the above whales again but off struck 2 and killed them and at 6 AM took the whales to the ship at 7 AM commenced cutting at 10 AM finished and made sail ship heading to the ESE by the wind Lat 30.26 N
