

We succeeded in getting up a small sail forward which enabled him to keep his before the wind that at midnight more moderate. At six o'clock, A. M. the wind light winds with a very heavy ground swell - all hands employed in rigging the stump of the foremast to set sail thereon - at 4 o'clock P. M. set fore sail and staysail double reefed, with intention of making the first port. Light variable winds inclined to a calm throughout the night and at midnight Thursday October 15th the wind light and variable rigging, a jury mast set. at 8 A. M. spoke a vessel bound to Maryland. at 2 P. M. saw the West end of Martha's Vineyard. North East by North, wind West, course North. at 7 P. M. the light bore East by North, five miles distant more ship to Westward. Light wind from the Northward.

Friday, October 16th first part a light breeze from the Northward. course West. at 7 o'clock P. M. wind shifted to South South West. at noon Rhode Island bore West North West, distance fifteen miles at three o'clock P. M. took a pilot and bore up for Newport Rhode Island. Harbor. where he arrived at 10 o'clock P. M. of this present day. then and there anchored his said vessel in a place of safety.
