

Ship Abigail towards the

Tuesday Nov the 3rd 1847

commenced with strong winds and squally weather
latter part more moderate Employed in breaking
out

Wednesday the 4th

first part light winds and pleasant Employed
in breaking out latter part strong winds
squally steering out So Ends

Friday the 5th

all of these 24 hours strong winds and squally
weather at 1 PM took the main sail and jib
latter part Employed in bending the main star sail
Lat 35-12 So Ends

Saturday the 6th

all of these 24 hours strong winds and pleasant
weather latter part Employed in fitting Boats
So Ends

Sunday the 7th

commenced with strong winds from the west
Employed in breaking for water at latter blowing
a gale the ship a scudding under double reefed
topsails

Monday the 8th

all of these 24 hours blowing a gale from
the westward at the ship scudding at 1 PM
took in the mizen topsails and close reefed
the fore at 5 took in fore sail and
fore topsails and luffed to the wind at
10 AM kept on away again So Ends
steering E by S

Tuesday the 9th

all of these 24 hours strong winds from the westward
steering E by S Employed doing various jobs
So Ends

Wednesday the 10th

commenced strong winds squally from the west
with 2 sails in sight at 10 PM the wind
hauling round to the southward and rained
latter part Employed breaking out the main topsail

Pacific Ocean

Thursday Nov the 11th 1847

all of these 24 hours fine breeze and pleasant
weather first part Employed in breaking out
yesterday saw a wreck it appeared to be a
ship on a logg brot in two latter part
Employed in making scrub rooms and fitting
Boats the wind to the westward steering
E S E So Ends

Friday the 12th

all of these 24 hours light winds and pleasant
weather first part Employed in breaking out
for brace and fitting Boats latter
part fitting Boats the wind to the westward
steering E S E So Ends

Saturday the 13th

all of these 24 hours light winds and pleasant
steering S E by E the wind from the westward
the first part Employed in fitting Boats and
rigging latter part breaking out the fore
hull So Ends

Sunday the 14th

first part strong winds and squally weather Employed
in breaking out the fore hold at 5 PM took in the
main topgallant sail and double reefed the topsails
and made the main sail latter part fine weather
the wind from the northward steering S E by E S E So Ends

Monday the 15th

all of these 24 hours fine winds and pleasant weather
latter part Employed in sending out the fly jib boom
and sending up mast standing sail steering S E by S the
wind from the northward So Ends

Tuesday the 16th

all of these 24 hours light winds and pleasant
weather first part Employed in sending
the fly jib and other small jobs
latter part setting up rigging So Ends
