

Ship Voyages from New Bedford

Wednesday January the 26th 1848
all of these 24 hours strong winds and
squally at 10 P.M. took in the fore
and mizen top sails shrouing & W by S
at 3 A.M. made sail at 9 made the
Island of St. Vincent at 12 noon 1st E. & S
Dist 25 miles

Thursday the 27th
first part light winds and
squally St. Vincent bearing at Dist 20
miles middle part calm with 3 ship
we exchanged signals with one she proved
to be the *Urapama* of N.B. as a m
a large sprang life from the Northward
shrouing & W by S Lat 58° 36' Long 65° 40'

Friday the 28th
first fine breeze from the N.E. shrouing
W by S. at 7 P.M. spoke the ship
Emerald of N.B. at 3 A.M. the wind
hailed to the westward and blowed
an very strong the under close reefed
top mizen top sails and reefed main sails
the *Emerald* in sight at 12 noon
Round to keep company with her
Lat 58° 05'

Saturday the 29th
first part strong winds from the westward
at 7 P.M. increased to a gale took in
all but a close main top sail and storm
sails. Latter part more moderate made
sail shrouing by the S & westward
the *Emerald* still in sight Lat 57° 27'

Sunday the 30th
all of these 24 hours strong at 10
P.M. now we under close reefed main
sails at 3 A.M. moderated and
a light sail latter in sight the
Emerald in sight Lat 58° 15'

Towards the Pacific Ocean

Monday the 31st of January 1848
all of these 24 hours strong winds
at 8 P.M. hauled aft so that she would
go her course to S.W. by W at 6 A.M.
hauled off at 6 A.M. wore ship to the
N.W. under double reefed top sails
Lat 58° 02' by 57° 43'

Tuesday the 1st of February 1848
all of these 24 hours strong winds
at 7 A.M. it hauled to the Northward
and blew on so that we had to wear
her too under close reefed top sails
at 11 P.M. hauled her away starboard and
set the fore sail and fore top sail
Lat 57° 55'

Wednesday the 2nd
commenced with a gale from the N.W.
speering to the under close reefed
top sails took all but a close reefed
main top sail a 3 set the fore and
mizen top sails again and reefed
the fore and main sails at 1 P.M.
at 6 P.M. took them in again at 7 took
in the fore sail and hove her too
the fore part of the night at 11
very heavy latter part at moderated
a little but still a gale.

Thursday the 3rd
first part blowing a gale from the N.W.
latter part more moderate at 6 P.M. ship too
the N.W. saw nothing Lat 57° 16'

Friday the 4th
first part light at 8 P.M. backed ship to
the N.W. at 12 the wind hauled so she
would go her course to S.W. at 6 A.M. hauled and
blew on took in all sail but fore sail & C.M. main
top sail Lat 57° 23' by 71° 50'
