

Ship Abigail from New Bedford

February the 17th Thursday 1848
 first part strong winds from the
 S. W. steering N. W. by N. middle part
 light winds the latter part the same
 Lat 31° 11'

Friday the 18th
 first part fine winds from the S. W.
 steering N. W. by N. middle part the wind hauled to the
 westward and the fresh came down
 and made hard. Latter part fine
 wind on almost a gale and hauled to
 the N. Lat 48° 12'

Saturday the 19th
 all of these 24 hours strong winds from
 the westward steering N. W. by N.
 at 5 P.M. saw a fin back

Sunday the 20th
 all of these 24 hours strong winds and
 squally weather from the southward steering
 N. W. by N. Lat 53° 17'

Monday the 21st
 all of these 24 hours strong winds from
 the southward and squally steering N. W. by N.
 Lat 54° 09'

Tuesday the 22nd
 all of these 24 hours strong winds from
 the southward steering N. W. by N.
 latter part hauled up the fore dory gallant
 mast Lat 37° 52'

Wednesday the 23rd
 all of these 24 hours light winds and
 foggy steering N. W. by N. Lat 31° 11' the
 main dory gallant mast at 7 P.M. spoke the
 Charles Carroll in company with the
 Dolly of New Bedford. Put right the Boat
 two masts

Thursday the 24th the 25th of Feb 1848
 all of these 24 hours strong winds and
 thick weather steering N. W. by N. at 11 P.M.
 hauled to and hauled back the main
 top sail under easy sail at 3 A.M. kept
 then off N. W. by N. at 5 raised the dory
 bearing N. W. by N. 30 miles

Friday the 25th
 all of these 24 hours strong winds from
 the southward at 2 P.M. the S. W. boats
 went in a fishing at Massachusetts at
 5 P.M. the Emerald came aboard and the Capt
 & 2nd mate came on board latter part in
 the main dory gallant mast steering by the
 Eastward

Saturday the 26th
 all of these 24 hours strong winds and
 squally weather at 4 P.M. the Capt went
 on board of the Emerald and made 22°
 made 8 knots hourly came on board at 10
 and we had one of the greatest games
 that I ever had to sea at 7 they
 returned to their own ship and not
 young set at the table and took tea with
 us for the first time we sailed from
 home after part broke out for water
 steering by the Eastward

Sunday the 27th
 first part strong winds from the S. W.
 steering by the Eastward at a bend an
 old main dory gallant sail latter part
 light winds with the Emerald still in
 company Lat 32° 16'
