

Ship Abigail Pennings

Monday the 20th of March 1848
all of the fore 24 hours strong to
wind and pleasant weather
at 5th P.M. spoke the George Howland
of N Bedford Capt Fisher 21 m 700
T dit. at 9 fore away again
Lat 33 34

Tuesday the 21st
all of the fore 24 hours light winds
and pleasant weather steering
to of S saw nothing

Wednesday the 22nd
all of the fore 24 hours light winds
saw nothing but 2 birds

Thursday the 23rd
first part light winds and pleasant
weather latter part the same at 6 am
called all hands washed off decks
saw fine birds and 13 fish

Friday the 24th
first part light winds and pleasant
weather at 2 P.M. lowered the S 13
for B. 13. and got more latter part
the same saw nothing at 6 called all
hands washed off decks

Saturday the 25th
the first part light winds and pleasant
at 1st P.M. saw 2 Boats a long
way off the land being so light
that we could not get near enough
to see what it was the latter part
the employed in breaking out for water
and other things this day put the other
center board boat on the beam
Lat 35 7

Down the off Ground to the Westward

Sunday the 26th of March 1848
first part light winds and pleasant
weather Employed in breaking out for
boards lat part light winds and raining

Monday the 27th
first part light winds and raining
latter part pleasant weather
Employed in setting the boats down
on chains even with the rail
saw nothing this day at 3 34

Tuesday the 28th
all of the fore 24 hours light winds
saw nothing but fine birds the first
part lat of the S Boat down even
with the rail latter part the to 13 the
same

Wednesday the 29th
first part weather moved the galley
forward on the fore castle latter
part raining

Thursday the 30th
first part raining latter part
pleasant steering to the westward
saw a great number of birds

Friday the 31st
first part raining latter part
fine weather steering to the westward
Employed in cleaning the iron work
and blacking it Lat 1 00 Long 108 00

Saturday the 1st of April 1848
first part light winds and pleasant
weather Employed in painting the iron
work latter part the same Employed
in cleaning the iron work steering
to the westward
