

Ship Abigail towards Moore

Monday April the 24<sup>th</sup> 1848  
all of these 24 hours strong trades  
steering N. & N. W. to Employed fitting  
men and tackles for stowing  
down all Lat 14 03 Long 143 54

Tuesday the 25<sup>th</sup>  
all of these 24 hours strong trades  
steering N. & N. W. at 1 a.m. took in sail  
with the intention of stowing down  
but it being so lugged that we gave  
it up and made sail again  
Lat 16 08 Long 147 08

Wednesday the 26<sup>th</sup>  
first part of these 24 hours strong  
winds latter part more moderate  
at 6 a.m. commenced heaving out the  
main masts to stow down at 1 P.M.  
commenced raining at 6 o'clock off for  
the night

Thursday the 27<sup>th</sup>  
commenced with rainy weather Employed  
in stowing down latter squally weather  
the Capt. I concluded to shoot off and  
leave 4 casks of oil in the fore hold  
on account of its raining so hard  
Lat 19 19 Long 152 20

Friday the 28<sup>th</sup>  
all of these 24 hours strong trades  
and squally weather steering N. & N. W.  
at 2 1/2 P.M.

Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup>  
all of these 24 hours strong winds  
and very thick weather at 6 P.M. took  
on sail at 12 close reefed the  
topsails and luffed too at 5 a.m.  
bore away again for home and  
did not let it until we could  
see the breakers

Ship Abigail in Moore

Saturday the 29<sup>th</sup> of April continued  
at 11 1/2 a.m. came too anchor

Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup> of May 1848  
at 12 P.M. took over anchor and  
ran down the passage for Wahee &  
latter part calm

Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup>  
at 1 1/2 P.M. anchored off Wahee bar  
at 3 the Capt. and his wife went on shore  
at 5 the Boat returned to the ship having  
the Capt. ashore at 6 a.m. the Boat  
went in again to Capt. but going  
things at 1 P.M. returned

Friday the 12<sup>th</sup>  
at 1 P.M. the Boat went in and  
took ashore 3 casks of oil then at  
at 6 returned to the ship
