Wednesday June the 7th 1848
all of these 24 hours light winds from the N. & blowing by to the Southward
rather part strong winds from the N.W. blowing by to the Southward

Thursday the 8th
just a part light winds from the Westward blowing by to the Southward
rather part strong winds and squally weather & Employed in fitting the trizen traps

Friday the 9th
all of these 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather

Saturday the 10th
all of these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward blowing West to

Sunday the 11th
all of these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward blowing West to

Monday the 12th
all of these 24 hours light winds from the Southward blowing by to the Westward

Tuesday the 13th
all of these 24 hours light winds from the Southward at 7 PM backed to the Southward at 1 PM to the Westward
and Day saw fire Back

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Wednesday the 14th of June 1848
all of these 24 hours light winds
saw nothing but fire Back at Sun
Down took in Sail at Daylight
called all hands made Sail
Lat 22.36 172.31 E

Thursday the 15th
all of these 24 hours light winds from the Westward at
Sundown took in Sail at Daylight
called all hands washed up Deck
and made Sail but saw nothing
but Porpoises Lat 23.36 173.45 E

Friday the 16th
all of these 24 hours light winds
and Calms at Sundown took in
Sail at Daylight called all hands

Saturday the 17th
all of these 24 hours light winds at 6 PM the Capt.
finished 2 men or 3 for
fighting one of them by the name
of Cox said that he would
do no more duty at
9 the Capt. called him on
Deck and sent to Masthead
until 11 o'clock and he concluded
to go to duty

Sunday the 18th
all of these 24 hours fine
winds from the Eastward
blowing to the Westward
saw nothing but Porpoises
& Grampuses
