Monday the 10th of July 1848
all of these 24 hours strong winds
at 2 P.M. sighted a ship and
proved to be the Naragansett Sanfucetti
Capt. Rodgers 23 months Nov 1866

Tuesday the 11th
all of these 24 hours strong winds
saw nothing but ship

Wednesday the 12th
all of these strong winds at 4 P.M.
sighted the ship Naragansett of
Sanfucetti Capt. Rodgers
and he came on board

Thursday the 13th
all of these 24 hours light
winds from the S.W.
steering by the N.E. at 6 am
were ship to the westward

Friday the 14th
all of these 24 hours light winds
from the S.W. saw nothing

Saturday the 15th
first part light winds and pleasant
weather at 1 P.M. latter part strong
winds and squally weather steering
S.E. saw 2 ships Lat 30° 30' South

Sunday the 16th
all of these 24 hours strong winds
and squally from the S. steering
S.E. 3210

On Japan

Monday the 17th July 1848
first part strong winds latter
part strong winds but clear
Lat 33° 20' 169-00

Tuesday the 18th
all of these 24 hours strong winds
and smoky weather steering by the
westward at 6 am backed to the
Eastward Lat 33° 30'

Wednesday the 19th
first part strong winds from the
southward latter part calm
sent down the fore top galant sail
at Lat 33° 12'

Thursday the 20th
first part light winds and
from the Eastward steering to the
Southward

Friday the 21st
all of these 24 hours fine
winds from the Eastward
steering to the westward at 6
am saw a ship steering S.W.

Saturday the 22nd
all of these 24 hours strong
winds from the Eastward
steering by the Southward
at 4 P.M. spoke the
ship Howard of Sanfucetti
Capt. Bunker 30 months Nov 1866
Lat 31° 15' 164-50

Sunday the 23rd
first part strong winds at 6
am were ship to the Eastward
