Monday July the 24th 1848
all of these 24 hours light
winds & fine weather at 12 M. 20
were ship the Southward 150 28 long 165 22

Tuesday the 25th
all of these 24 hours light winds
blowing by to the Eastward
Employed in making 1 truck

Wednesday the 26th
all of these 24 hours light
winds and pleasant weather blowing
by to the Eastward at 9 a.m.
the Saragatette of Vancouver
passed us

Thursday the 27th
all of these 24 hours light
winds from the Southward
blowing by to the Eastward

Friday the 28th
all of these 24 hours light winds
from the Southward blowing by to
the Eastward at 9 a.m. I saw
a sail off the 10 quarter and
backed ship to the westward
at 11 saw another at backed
again Lat 30 27 long 168 09

Saturday the 29th
all of these 24 hours the first part fine
weather 3000 3000 the Saragatette
the An Alexander & and the A Adams
were in part heavy squalls latter part
the same 2 ships in sight

On Japan

Sunday July the 30th 1848
first part strong winds from the
Southward at 6 P.M. have too under
the An Topsail Chase kept latter
part more moderate blowing to
the Eastward in company with
the Saragatette

Monday the 31st
first part strong winds from
the Southward blowing by
to the Eastward middle part
strong winds and very heavy
squalls & rain with 3 ships
in sight at sundown have
too again

Tuesday the 1st of August 1848
all of these 24 hours strong
winds & squalls from the Southward
blowing by to the Eastward in
company with the Saragatette

Wednesday the 2^d
all of these 24 hours light
winds from the Southward
Employed in repairing sail
at 5 P.M. gained with 18
latter part employed in
breaking between decks

Thursday the 3^d
first part light fine winds pleasant
blowing by to the Eastward in
company with the A Lat 31 00 172 10

Friday the 4th
all of these calm and rainy
