Sunday the 6th
all of these 24 hours light winds
at 6 PM spoke the Milton 11 months
150 Capt. Smith & Maragansett
Lat 31.16

Monday the 7th
all of these 24 hours light winds
& pleasant steering N

Tuesday the 8th
all of these 24 hours light winds
pleasant weather steering N 1/2 E

Wednesday the 9th
all of these 24 hours light
winds from the Eastward steering
to the N 1/2 E in the day & N in the Night
at 11 saw a sail

Thursday the 10th
all of these 24 hours light winds
& steering N 1/2 E in the day
& N in the Night at 2 signalized
the 5th ship proved to be the
Milton saw 1 of 3 back

Friday the 11th
first part fine weather at 1 am
spoke the B Garland Capt
Crown latter part squally

Saturday the 12th
all of these 24 hours
light winds from the E
for 11 miles in distance
& saw 1 plant, a gamet with them

On Japan

Sunday the 13th of July 1848
first part pleasant weather
latter part squally Lat 31.15 167.00

Monday the 14th
first part squally latter part
pleasant weather

Tuesday the 15th
all of these 24 hours fine weather
steering by the Northward

Wednesday the 16th
all of these 24 hours fine
weather steering by the
Northward Mr B. Repulse
his Boat & painted her

Thursday the 17th
all of these 24 hours fine weather
saw nothing Lat 167

Friday the 18th
first part fine weather
latter part raining the winds
from the Southward

Saturday the 19th
all of these 24 hours strong
the winds from the S

Sunday the 20th
first part the wind hauled
round the Northward steering
by the wind to the Eastward
at 6 backed S to the N
latter part strong winds
and a heavy sea
