Friday the 15th of Sept. 1848
wind & weather Shewing different
courses in hopes of seeing the whales
again at 1st Pm raised them again
at & lowered the 1 & 2nd boats and
went down to the water but they
were so irregular that we could not
hear them nor in boats chased
them until sundown without success
and then returned to the ship
and took in the fore & mizen topsails
and shewed the way the whales were
going to by N until 2³⁰ Pm then dipped
hook at 7³⁰ a saw them again going
S to by W then went down and rode
once 1 hour & ¹/₄ they then went down
again and we saw them no more now
they either went down until the next
morn or changed their course and went
out of sight, But how they could
do the latter I cannot tell as
it was very clear, but they are gone
however it is an affair worth full
in their other manovers To End

Saturday the 16th the
fine & warmer first part returning by
the 16th & 17th at 5th M. Dashed so
the boatmen saw nothing but porpoises
Sat 30 or 179. 05

Sunday the 11th
fine weather & light winds
saw Porpoises
Long 29 1/2 1851/3

Monday the 18th
first strong winds from the E. blowing
by 10 the S. E. Middle part slightly
battered and calm. Employed in
making a new account Book & by
Saw all papers.

Tuesday The 19th of Sept: 1848
fine & weather this day fitted a
thump. To rep gallant mast used sent
it in 27th 1848

Wednesday the 20th
light winds from the Eastward
Employed in digging the fore
trench digging & sitting it up
Broke out for washes
2926 17834

Thursday the 21st
light & winds subsiding by to the
S & employed making spun yarn
and making a mixed box of allant
most from an old form

Friday the 22^d
gave fine weather Employed in
making a mizen rope gallant mast
at 8 m. took her out, turned
at 6 o'clock ship to be covered
at 8 a m. sent down the mizen
rope gallant mast and skinned
the Back Stays and reserved
them

Saturday the 23rd
 fine weather. Employed in getting
 the mizen top gallant rigging
 Lathes finished the new mast
 and new rigging throughout

2 Sunday the 24th the
winds from the Eastward
blowing by to the North first
past Chylora in sending the mizen
popeallant mast at 11 the masted
ship to the S E lat 31 47 N. or
S E
