

Ship Ariguel Cruising

Wednesday the 4th of Oct 1848
Strong winds at 3 PM spoke
a British Ship. A part of Harore
11 months 1000 Bbls 10 cdt Borneo to
Sydney. Latter part Employed in
Storing the oil

Thursday the 5th
first B.R. but for water and
Bread and got ready for Storing
oil at 5 PM called all hands
commenced Storing but at 10 PM
oil in main harbours 150 cdt

Friday the 6th
fine weather the wind from N.E. Storing
by 10 PM the E.S. & Employed in Storing oil
at 11 PM all finished Storing. The oil
showed 110 Bbls

W. 110 5

Saturday the 7th
light winds Employed in repairing
Casks

Sunday the 8th
Calm Saw grampasses

Monday the 9th
first part calm much rain a
light breeze from N.W. to 11 AM
Saw a part of a large whale
upheld by a hand moved to
main yard at daybreak. Called all
hands and saw the whale covered
3 hours the 10th Boat was a gain. On
when the 1st Boat came down on
his eye and he settled within
2 min of the 10th. The whale
then went to windward we
beat to windward 4 hours but saw no
more of him.



On Japan

Tuesday the 10th of Oct 1848
Strong winds first part Storing
to the Eastward at sundown
luffed too on the 1st back London
Close luffed main topsail
at daylight first away to
the Eastward again
Employed in Repeating a 1st topsail
for 10 fore 173 31 31.00

Wednesday the 11th
Strong winds and squally weather
from the N.E. Storing to the
Eastward middle part under
close luffed topsails
Repeating sails and to haul
gear

Thursday the 12th
Strong winds from the Westward
Storing E.S. & Latter part
the 1st wind hauled round to the
Eastward at

Friday the 13th
first the wind from the North
and rain

Saturday the 14th
all of these 24 hours strong
winds from the N.E. Storing
by 10 the Eastward rain
at 1 PM were 2 ships to
the 18 PM to 1740 E

Sunday the 15th
light from the N.W. Storing
by the Southward at
Latter part Storing to the
Eastward Saw first dark
