

Ship Abigail towards the Island

Wednesday March the 21st 1849
Commenced with fine weather and
light winds from the N.W. Steering
to the westward at 2^{1/2} P.M.
brought ship to the N.E. the Milton
in company latter part Employed
in fitting the W. Boat and
breaking out for B. & Channing
the W. Boat

Thursday the 22nd
light winds and calm Employed
in this day rowed down
the hill between the

Friday the 23rd
Employed in Repairing Sails
sent down the mizen reef sail
and repaired it the Milton
still in company Lat 31

Saturday the 24th
Calm and pleasant weather
first part Brought a new fore reef sail
latter part Employed in Repairing
the old one Lat 31 at 11 A.M. the
Capt & his Lady went on board of
the Milton to spend the day

Sunday the 25th Lat 3:02 Long
first part calm Capt & Lady on
board of the Milton Brought a fore
sail at 11 P.M. returned latter
part calm Lat 3:43 Long 166:52

Monday the 26th
at 3^{1/2} P.M. a light sprang up from
the Eastward of latter part
Employed in painting the W. Boat
4:15

of Attention

Tuesday the 27th of March 1849
first part light winds from
the Eastward of Steering N.W.
latter part Squally and B. & Channing
winds with Rain and Thunder
and lightning Steering N.W. by N
this day the day out per first book
Wednesday the 28th Lat 5:40 Long 165:35
first part light winds
and squally weather this day at 3
P.M. first received that the
little plaything Ann & Ana but
the first boat at the age of 9 months
old latter part B. & Channing
and Rain at 3^{1/2} A.M. it
being not prudent to run we used
the wind on the 29th back to
N by E at 5 A.M. put her off
her course again Lat

Thursday the 29th
first part strong trades and
squally weather Steering W
latter part the same at 11
am. Brought the W. Boat

Friday the 30th
Strong trades Steering W latter
part Steering N.W. by N
Lat 6:36 Long 159:50
View of Wellington Island Bearing S by E
Dist 5 miles Lat 6:40 Long 157:50

Saturday the 31st
Strong trades Steering W by W at 1 P.M.
Raised this Island at sundown the
Island in S & E Dist 5 miles
