Sunday the 19th
 first part strong winds and
 squally from the S. to the N.
 Latter part fine weather steering
 by the S. C.

Monday the 20th
 fine weather the wind from the
 S. to steering by the S. C. at 6 P.M.
 spoke the Milton. Capt. Young went
 on board of her a few
 minutes latter part mending
 Sails

Tuesday the 21st
 first part calm latter part
 the wind spring up from the
 S. C. the Milton in sight

Wednesday the 22nd
 fine weather the wind from
 the S. C. steering by the S. C.

Thursday the 23rd
 Strong winds and foggy
 the Milton in sight
 saw fin Back

On Lapan

Friday Mar the 24th 1849
 first part light and foggy
 steering by the S. C. at 8 P.M. luffed
 too being too foggy to pull
 and saw any thing till at 9 P.M.
 saw the last of Milton
 latter part foggy. Raining with
 some thunder lightning and
 strong winds

Saturday the 25th
 first part strong winds from
 the Southern steering by the
 S. C. at 7 P.M. took in sail
 and were ship to the westward
 at 9 A.M. to the eastward under close reefed top sail

Sunday the 26th
 first part blowing a gale from
 the S. the ship being too shelter
 a close reefed main top sail and fore
 latter part Raining strong gale from
 the Southern at 1 P.M. saw ship
 to the westward at 10 P.M. the S. C.
 at 11 P.M. the wind hauled round to
 the N.W. so ends as miserable as ever

Monday the 27th
 another day of hopeless despair
 has commenced, Raining with the
 wind from the S. C. steering by the S. C.
 latter part light winds from
 eastward foggy steering by the
 the Southern till 3 P.M.

Tuesday the 28th
 first part calm at 3 P.M. saw
 a school of black fish at 4 P.M.
 back at sundown took in the top
 top sail latter part blowing strong
 from the S. C. steering by the
 under close reefed top sail
 broke out for water
