Thursday June the 7th 1849
 commenced with cutting the
 rigging at 4 P.M. finished and
 commenced Boiling on the
 head latter part light winds from
 the S.E. at 7 A.M. more ship
 to the Northward at 9 finished the
 head and commenced the Body

Friday the 8th 1849
 commenced Boiling with the wind
 from the S.E. blowing so that
 latter part the winds from the
 Southward at 6 A.M. put her off
 to S.W. and raised a sail

Saturday the 9th 1849
 at 10 A.M. spoke the Milton Capt
 Smith came on board and took
 dinner with us at 1 P.M. Capt
 Young and lady went on board
 of the Milton and spent the
 afternoon since we last saw
 them no news had been
 from the Fore top gallant mast
 while in a fainting fit it did
 not injure him seriously to all
 appearances for what was a getting
 better at 5 P.M. finished
 Boiling and washed off
