of Nantucket 12 months
of 450 Bbls of Oil at 6.
Saw a Bright Shark with
something making white water in
it and supposed to be a wounded
whale we ran off for it and
found it to be a school of
Killers

Tuesday the 11th
strong breezes from the Eastward
steering to the Eastward
Saw a plenty of Junco 2918

Wednesday the 12th
strong breezes from the N.E. steering
by to the E.S. & saw
juncos nothing more

Thursday the 13th
strong winds from the N.E.
steering by to the S.E. at 6 A.M.
bore a ship to the Northward
Employed making new Strops for the
main topgallant & Breast Back Stay 16220

Friday Sept. the 14th 1849
first part strong winds from the
N.E. steering by to the N. & gathered
under Double Reefed top Sails
2928 16240

Saturday the 15th
strong winds from the
Eastward latter part Employed
in breaking out for water in
the B. hells and taking the old
ropes cast that was stowed
home and found them in a
Bad State 3030

Sunday the 16th
strong breezes and heavy
from the Eastward 3022

Monday the 17th
first part strong winds
and squally from the East
at 1 P.M. bore a ship to the S.E.
at 11 P.M. raised a Sail
steering to the N. & gathered
at 6 A.M. to the Northward

Tuesday the 18th
light breezes from the Eastward
Employed in driving the Oil
Between Decks

Wednesday the 19th
first part moderate breezes
latter part strong breeze
from the N.E. steering by to
the E.S. & Employed in making
stitching the main top sail
