Saturday Oct. the 13th 1849  
first part strong winds  
from the N N E steering by  
to the Eastward under close  
reefed topsails Employed in mending  
main topsail at 2 P.M. 3 Bells  
La strong that we could not  
saw the patches on at 6 P.M.  
were ship to the N W  
latter part slight winds  
Employed in breaking out for  
weather Mrs Young and Child  
more comfortable

Sunday the 14th  
first part light winds from  
the Northward steering by to  
the N W at 5 P.M.  
more to the N E after the  
wind hauled to the N W at  
6 Set the fore topmast Stuy  
Sail and sent up the  
fore top Gallant yard and  
set the sail, Mrs Young and  
Child more comfortable  
but very weak, Lat 29:57 Long 178:44

Monday the 15th  
first part strong winds from  
the N W steering N E  
latter part the hauled to the  
Northward equally steering by to  
the Eastward to the N E by S  
Thought Mrs Young is any the  
mending hamp but Child appears  
rather more able to day than she  
has been for 2 or 3 days  
but she will better at sundance  
as Mrs Young improves in health  
for her are more fit to doctor her than  
human being especially Children

towards the Sandwich Islands

Tuesday Oct. the 16th 1849  
first part strong winds from the  
N N E steering by to the Eastward  
latter part of calm Employed  
Repairing the main topsail  
and hoisting down Mrs Young is  
improving slowly but much  
redressed in flesh and strength  
but the baby is about the same  
very feeble old hands in complaining  
more or less there is some  
sintons of the scurvy among them

Wednesday the 17th  
first part the wind sprang up from  
the S E steering N E middle  
part the wind hauled more to the west  
and began to rain latter part  
more moderate the wind to N W  
Employed in sail mending  
Mrs Young not quite so well as  
she has been she is very weak  
and the operation that she makes  
to take care of the baby her  
recovery the child is not as  
lively as has been she had a crying  
spell this afternoon and at 7 P.M.  
she was still as looking the same  
as a child of 10 years would

Lat 30:29 Long

Thursday the 18th  
first part strong winds from  
the Northward with squalls  
at 6 P.M. Double reefed the  
topsails Lat part moderate  
and clear Employed Repairing  
sails and old water P.P.ess  
Mrs Young and Child is better
