Tuesday January the 15th 1830
first part Strong Trade
lying off and on Boats
at 4 1/2 PM put away
at 10 AM saw a Spout
and thought it to be a Whale
but saw it no more

Wednesday the 16th
Strong Trade Steering
S.W.

Thursday the 17th
Strong Trade Steering
S.W.

Friday the 18th
fine weather Steering to
the Westward

Saturday the 19th
fine weather

Sunday the 20th
light winds at 3

Monday the 21st
first part calm at 3 PM
lowered for 3 dark fish
but did not get any

Tuesday the 22nd
light winds and calm

Wednesday the 23rd
light winds at 10 AM
picked up the canoe with one native
in it almost famished he said
that there was 4 when they left &
having died

On the Line Ground

Wednesday Jan the 23rd 1830
Continued of Hunger the days
as near as we can understand
that it is 7 days since they left Byron's
Island at 8 PM picked a Spil

Thursday the 24th
at 5 PM the Capt lowered
his Boat and went on Board
of her she was a French Bark

Friday the 25th
light winds and Baffling

Saturday the 26th
light winds and Baffling
at 7 PM it hauled
to the S.W. and blew and
rained hard latter part
Pleasant

Sunday the 27th
aft of these 4 hours Strong
squalls from the Westward
and Rainy the Bark still
in sight

Monday the 28th
first part Strong winds from
the Westward with heavy rain
at 4 took in the jib and
double reefed at 5 took
in the Fore top sail and close
reefed the main and mizen
at 6 bore ship to the S.W.
