On Saturday the 10th they arrived and
came to anchor in the harbor of Boston. Here
when the captain noted his protest as
aforesaid and called a survey.

On Wednesday the 11th the schooner
was taken in tow by the Steamer Telegraph
and brought to New Bedford, where
she arrived about 8 o'clock P. M.

Since then appearance do further declare
before me the said Notary, that at the time
of her departure from Boston and up to the
occurrence of the disaster as aforesaid, the
said schooner was tight, staunch and sea-
worthy, well and sufficiently manned
equipped and furnished with all things
necessary for her intended voyage, and that
on the eighth day of February aforesaid, and
at all times since her departure from
Boston and until her arrival at New
Bedford as aforesaid, they the said appearers
with the rest of the officers and crew did
every thing in their power to preserve the
said schooner her tackle, apparel and
cargo from damage.

Wherefore the said appearers do
declare to protest as by their presents they
do solemnly protest, against the winds
waves, tides, currents, and all and
every the perils of navigation for all
loss detriment or damage, suffered or
sustained by said vessel in her hull, tackle
apparel or cargo, the same having occurred
as is before stated and not through the
insufficiency of said vessel or her tackle
or through the inattention or neglect of
these appearers, or any of them who all
in the contrary did their duty faithfully

and to the best of their ability.
