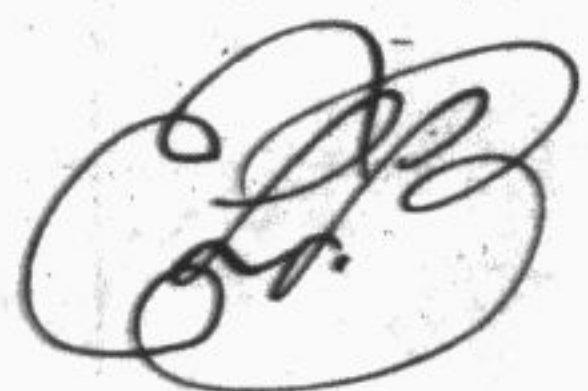

On this tenth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty nine at the request of James B.
